Jesse Colquitt "J.C." Thomas

Jesse Colquitt "J.C." Thomas, 94, of Macon, died Tuesday, July 4, 2006 at his residence after an extended illness.

He was born July 16, 1911 to the late Harriett Emily Thomas and Elijah Madison Thomas in Turner County.
